The event takes place Saturday and Sunday, September 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 am – 1:00 pm at the parking lot in front of K-Mart, 19330 Hawthorne Boulevard, Torrance. You must be a Southern California Edison residential customer to participate in this Lamp Exchange. Bring your SCE bill and/or CA driver's license that shows your zip code falls within SCE service territory. Limit of 10 working lamps per household per day and while quantities last.
